HISTORY

ale MUN Korea is an annual Model United Nations Conference for high school students hosted by the Yale International Relations Association (YIRA) in Seoul, South Korea. YIRA is a nonprofit student organization at Yale University that aims to raise awareness of and stimulate debate about global affairs and international relations. Yale MUN Korea held its first annual conference in the spring of 2012, but its partner organization, YMUN, has been in place since 1974. Yale MUN Korea is the first conference in Asia to be hosted single-handedly by an American university. With a spirit of both tradition and innovation, along with the Yale commitment to educational excellence, Yale MUN Korea is rapidly making itself known as one of the premier educational simulations of international relations in Asia.

In its committees and throughout the conference, Yale MUN Korea has always encouraged delegates to think thoroughly, quickly, and creatively through structured and constructive debate on a variety of relevant issues. Overseen by Yale student staffers, Yale MUN Korea offers a vast range of historically and geographically diverse committees on international peace, security, and socioeconomic progress each year.

Our secretariat is a group passionate Yale students who, in tandem with South Korean high school upperclassmen, are dedicated to organizing the best intellectual and social conference experience for delegates. The Secretariat are welltrained in MUN protocol, and their committees utilize unique YMUN procedure, a hallmark of our renowned Yale conferences. FINANCIAL AID PROGRAM:

ONLINE DELEGATE TRAINING PLATFORM:



WHAT IS MODEL UNITED NATIONS?

Model United Nations provides students with the opportunity to learn about and discuss today's most relevant issues in international diplomacy through participation in an academic simulation of the many bodies of the United Nations as well as other similar international organizations.

Through the process of pre-conference research and in-conference debate, caucusing, and resolution writing, delegates work together to fashion solutions to these questions, while simultaneously articulating the opinions of the real United Nations ambassadors and delegates whom they represent.

By converting this research into resolutions and material for discussion in committees, students hone their analytical abilities, while the debate and lobbying processes afford students the opportunity to practice their public speaking and conflict resolution skills. Through academic research, intellectual debate, public speaking, and group problem-solving, Model United Nations allows participants to hone their understanding of global issues and their ability to think critically about them.

COMMITTEES

OVERVIEW

At Yale, we pride ourselves on our commitment to rigorous debate. Students here engage in serious conversations about the issues that matter both in and out of the classroom. The committees at Yale MUN Korea will offer an authentic taste of the university experience. Chairs are chosen from the ranks of Yale's most enthusiastic and knowledgeable, bringing expertise necessary to ensure the success and academic rigor of every committee. Yale MUN Korea's delegates also contribute their own unique perspectives; Yale MUN Korea 2016 brought together delegates from over 11 countries including China, Japan, Indonesia, The Philippines, Mongolia, India, Australia, and Jordan. At Yale MUN Korea, we hope to bring the spirit and culture of debate at Yale into the lives of high school students around the world.

In 2014, Yale MUN debuted Yale MUN Procedure (formerly Hybrid) to create a conference that provides the best experience for our delegates. Yale MUN Procedure is an innovative MUN procedure that builds on strengths of both US and international procedure: expands on the US Procedure's focus on collaboration and public speaking, while incorporating the international style's focus on content and writing. Yale MUN Korea will be using Yale MUN Procedure, which is structured so that each topic is debated equally throughout the conference.

By the end of the conference, delegates will have debated and voted on one resolution per topic, worked directly with their Chairs on the content of the debate, and improved their writing, public speaking, and debating skills. This procedure allows delegates to focus in on specific aspects of the topic and then incorporate all of these concepts into one resolution for the issue. Yale MUN Procedure returns MUN to its original spirit: diplomacy, collaboration, and problem-solving.

DELEGATE TRAINING

Recognizing that delegates come with varying levels of experience, Yale MUN Korea hosts a delegate training session that outlines parliamentary procedure, the structure of committee debate, and strategies for participating in debate. In addition to the training session, online training materials will be available prior to the conference. Both help to ensure that all delegates can fully participate in and get the most out of the conference. Delegates will also be able to receive feedback from their chairs on their position papers.

JOIN US: REGISTRATION

INDIVIDUAL DELEGATE REGISTRATION

Yale MUN Korea is a Model UN conference for students in Grades 9 to 12 or equivalent by the time of the conference. Given the Korean education system, all students between the ages of 13 to 18 are eligible, even if currently in what is termed 'middle school' in Korea. Students who have begun their undergraduate studies by the time of the conference are ineligible for participation. Registration forms are available on the website.

GROUP DELEGATION REGISTRATION

Yale MUN Korea welcomes group delegations from both Korean and international schools. Groups of 5 delegates or more are eligible for group delegate registration through the registration page. There is a per-delegate discount of \$10 for groups of 5 students or more, and \$20 for groups of 10 or more.

PAYMENT INFORMATION

Registration and conference placement will be processed on a rolling basis. After registering, delegations must fully pay their registration fee within 7 days from online registration and no later than May 7th, 2017. Fees are payable through either domestic account transfer or international wire transfer, bank account information will be sent via automated email after online registration.

Failure to make the payment on time will lead to cancellation of registration.

Students will receive a payment verification email upon sending payment.

If payment is under a parent's name, you must notify the USGs of Delegations of the account holder's name at ymunkorea.domestic@yira. org or ymunkorea.international@yira.org. Include your full name (in Korean and English), your school, and your registration date with your payment.

FINANCIAL AID

Yale MUN Korea is committed to allowing students from all socioeconomic backgrounds to participate in our conference through financial aid. Delegates registered both as individuals and as a group are eligible to apply, but delegates from group delegations must apply for financial aid individually as opposed to applying for the entire delegation.

Please submit your Financial Aid Application within two weeks of online registration and no later than May 7th, 2017. As applications will be considered on a rolling basis, delegates should submit their application promptly, as there are limited funds available for financial aid.

WILL FOOD BE PROVIDED?

Yale MUN Korea 2017 will be providing lunch and dinner for our delegates during the conference. Delegates are also able to eat at nearby restaurants for any meal except for the delegate dinner, but we will not be covering those meals.

WILL ACCOMMODATION BE PROVIDED?

Upon request, Yale MUN Korea 2017 will offer accommodation arrangements at Seoul Olympic Parktel. Delegates will be assigned accommodation with up to three other delegates of the same gender per room and charged accordingly apart from the delegate fee.

IS THERE ANY WAY DELEGATES CAN PREPARE FOR THE CONFERENCE?

Yale MUN Korea 2017 is newly launching a free online delegate training platform for all delegates. It begins on March 27th, 2017, and advisors are recommended to require or encourage their delegates to complete the training program.


WHERE CAN I FIND MORE INFORMATION ABOUT DEBATE PROCEDURE AND COMMITTEE TOPICS?

Viceand Chairs will assist Yale USGs run their committee. Eligibility for ASG and SA positions are limited to Korean students; VC positions are open to students of any nationality.


